

Behold! Or, Don't Waste Your Easter

A word from Pastor Jonathan Evans

"He has also set eternity in the hearts of men; yet they cannot fathom what God has done from beginning to end." Ecclesiastes 3:11b

The gospel *must* be central because nothing else even comes close to filling the eternal gap. We all agree that fallen man has a "God -shaped hole," as St. Augustine once said, but then we go on to suggest all kinds of fillers that are not God financial security, job security, awesome house, great internet service. relationships, healthy healthy body (!), successful marriages, happy spouses and children. community service. outlets for our creativity, etc. All good things but all things you can have and do and still be eternally bankrupt.

Quite a number of Easters ago after I had preached an Easter message at the Sunrise service, a guy came up to me afterwards and said, "Thank you. I can't tell you how refreshing it is to hear about the resurrection on Easter." I sort of laughed, figuring he was joking. That week I listened to the message podcast from the church service he mentioned he had attended the past Easter. It was a large church in another part of the country. He was not joking.

In years past, churches have opened Easter Sunday services with AC/DC songs, laser light shows, egg drops from helicopters, and in PA I drove past a church giving a car away during the Easter Service, as well as a myriad of things along those lines. This year the need to outdo last is pressing. One very large church was giving away automobiles (plural) and other prizes.

The simple explanation for all this is that they want people to hear about the resurrection, and these are some of the ways churches attempt to get people in proximity to hear the message. I am reminded of when Jesus tells the rich man in hell that if his surviving family didn't believe Moses and the prophets, they weren't going to believe a resurrected man. Does that sound backwards to you? The same principle is at stake here. If the message that Jesus died and came back to life (!) isn't compelling enough to draw people, the enticement of winning a car is not going to cut it. Anyone who believes in Christ because they were

attracted by "stuff" has been won over to the prosperity gospel, not the cross, not the crucifixion gospel.

The harder explanation for all this is that the PT Barnum pastoral tribe doesn't trust that the gospel is a compelling message. They don't trust that they can make it sound attractive and exciting just as it is. They've lost trust that it is, actually, power. If they hadn't, they wouldn't feel the need to put it inside the Trojan horse of cash and prizes.

Why do churches treat the resurrection like it's the heartworm medicine you put in a hot dog to trick the dog? The truth is that all the bombast, the flash, the publicity, the attractions are a waste. They are the offer of mud pies, because we just can't figure out how to sell a holiday at sea.

C. S. Lewis put it so well when he wrote:

"It would seem that Our Lord finds our desires not too strong, but too weak. We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea. too easily pleased." We far are of Glory, and Other The Weight Addresses

(You see, really, the holiday sells itself.)

Our scale is far too small. The Bible speaks to all manner of good things useful to all people, but the Church is starving (starving!) for the glory of God. We too easily forget that the gospel covers the scale of eternity, that it is the division between real life and death, that God is infinite, and our sin is a condemnationworthy offense against an eternally holy and just God. We preach and we settle for much less than, "Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God!"

Every week people file into church services aching for hope today, and the hope of eternity. Yet, how sad it is, that in our zeal to something provide they may find comfortable and useful and inoffensive, are we offending the God who wishes to offend us in awe of His glory? Are we dismissing our Lord Jesus whose formula for victory includes crucifixion? I think of that so often as we approach Good Friday. A verse that has struck me lately is this from the Apostle Paul writing to the Corinthians: "And he (Jesus Christ) died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again" (2 Corinthians 5:15).

That's the reason why the hymn ends ...

Soar we now where Christ has led, alleluia! Following our exalted Head, alleluia! Made like him, like him we rise, alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave, the skies, alleluia!

The cross? The grave? The skies? What are we talking about? If you're a Christian, he loves you like that. That love is indestructible. That love has destroyed death. That love will not let death take you out either. Therefore, no matter what happens to you ... cross, graves, or skies ... it's all ours. It's all ours. Every part of it. Everything! The worst thing that can happen to you is that you die, and it makes you the best. It makes you glorious. It makes you like him if you're a Christian.

Everything ... everything ... is part of his loving plan for you. He is not going to let anything take you down. His love for you has already experienced the ultimate for you. What's that mean? What does it mean?

It means Jesus Christ has been raised from the dead.

That is the most important fact in history. That's the center of your life. It's the center of the church. It's the center of the Christian message. It's what our lives are all about. Do you understand that? Have you taken that in?

The scale is enormous, the stakes are high. This Easter, instead of spiritually dressing up the idols we know people want, let's give them what they need — God all in all, the filling of the Spirit, the exaltation of the risen Lord.

"Behold what manner of love the Father has given unto us, that we should be called the sons of God!" – 1 John 3:1a

I believe that above all should be the chief goal of our worship services — *beholding*. Behold our glorious God and his lavishing of grace on us in his precious Son who has done all things— humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross, taking the penalty for all our sins, and has risen (alleluia!), and ascended to the right hand of the Father.

"For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen." – Romans 11:36

May you have a blessed and glorious Easter!
